 - b. The breadth of the prayer
 - (1) All prayer and petition
 - (2) At all times
 - (3) For all the saints
 - c. The intensity of the prayer
 - (1) Be alert
 - (2) All perseverance
- 2. Picture is that of defending others by alert and pointed petition
