A. The Setting

B. <i>The Dream</i>	
 A Structure: Behold a ladder set on the earth with its top [head] reaching to heaven 	
a) The Hebrew word for "ladder" is and this is the only occurrence of the word in all of Scripture. Scholars disagree as to what he saw.
