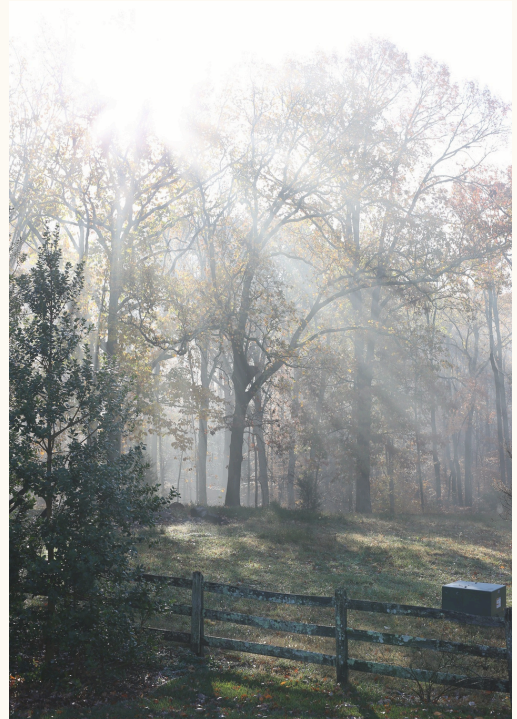

ADMISSIONS

General Requirements:

Age:

Each applicant must be 18 years of age or older at the time of registration. However, applicants may be 17 years old if they will be turning 18 by December 31 of that year (this is only applicable for those applying for the fall semester).

Education:

Each applicant must be a high school graduate or have obtained a GED.

Language:

Each applicant must have a working knowledge of the English language.

Theology:

Each applicant must be in agreement with our Doctrinal Statement.

The Right Spirit:

Do You Have A Teachable Spirit?

In the early chapters of Proverbs, Solomon presents a teachable spirit as the essence of wisdom. A wise man receives instruction. The Lord said, "The one who has ears to hear, let him hear." Crowds of people listened to the teaching of the Lord. Sadly, most went away untouched. They came to consider not to respond. Seeking hearts are teachable hearts that listen closely to the Lord and respond to Him with obedient faith.

Do You Have A Team-Oriented Spirit?

Early on in his christian experience, John Wesley was greatly impacted by a man who told him, "Sir, you wish to serve God and go to heaven. Remember you cannot serve Him alone. You must therefore find companions or make them. The Bible knows nothing of solitary religion." God does not call us to live the christian life alone. When we become a child of God, we also become part of Christ's body. That body, which is to work and function as a group, requires both participation and adaptability. God loves unity and speaks most clearly to His people when this is true of a group. Each student must be ready to set aside personal considerations for the benefit of others.

ADMISSIONS

The Right Spirit cont:

Do You Have A Faithful Spirit?

Paul told Timothy to entrust the truth to faithful men who would be able to teach others. Interestingly, Paul did not say gifted men, intellectual men, or personable men. God desired faithful men.

Testing faithfulness in young men and women is not simple. Interestingly, one of the few indications of faithfulness given in Scripture has to do with money. "He who is faithful in small things is also faithful in much." The small thing referred to here is the use of money. If that is not handled righteously, the Lord asks how God could entrust into a man's hands true (spiritual) riches. How we handle the financial responsibilities of life gives an indication of how we will handle spiritual responsibilities.

We have a no-debt policy. We require, therefore, that any accumulated debt be adequately handled before taking on the further obligation of tuition for school. Faithfulness also means meeting obligations. Students must be able to demonstrate that they will be able to meet all biblical family and personal obligations while they are attending EI.

Do You Have A Controlled Spirit?

We must make it clear that our ministry is discipleship-training, not in-depth counseling or rehabilitation. We recognize the need for both of these ministries, and have found through experience that our program is not a substitute for helping those whose needs require these specialized ministries. Applicants, therefore, must be free of addictive behavior, such as drugs, alcohol, tobacco, pornography, etc. Past difficulty in these areas does not disqualify anyone from attending, but there must be a definite, demonstrated deliverance before undertaking the pressures of training. Our course of study is intense, and students must be physically and emotionally capable of meeting the demands of the program.

Students take up to 3 classes a day!



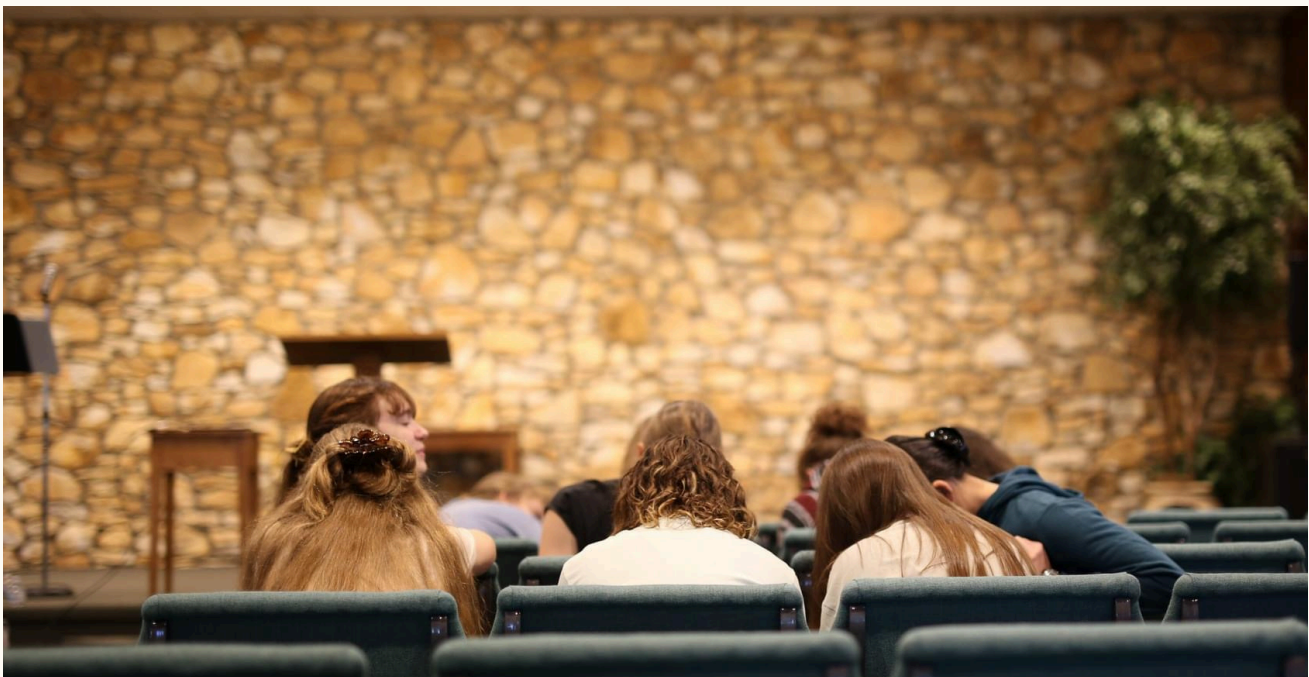
QUIET TIMES

Prayer is a vital ingredient to spiritual health; therefore, the development of a vital prayer life demands much more than instruction. Prayer is a skill that must be learned by experience and practice. At EI, we have structured the schedule to provide multiple opportunities to develop a devotional life through prayer.

Time is allotted daily to allow students to be alone with the Lord in prayer and the Word. A combination of daily discipline and guidance from staff enables each student to discover and develop a quiet time that matches the individual's needs and temperamental bents.

Prayer times are frequent and varied. **Through prayer partners, small group prayer, days of prayer, corporate worship and prayer with the local church,** we seek to give the Lord an opportunity to teach about prayer in all its multiple expressions.

Keeping Costs Low

In addition to personal growth, students reap other benefits of serving together. Tuition is kept to a minimum by student participation in daily maintenance. **All students serve four hours a week** in maintaining our program activities. Everyone is involved. The mature Christian is a servant at heart.



Quick Facts:

Every student serves 4 hours a week to help maintain the campus. This includes grounds work, building maintenance, cafeteria service, housekeeping, and administrative tasks.

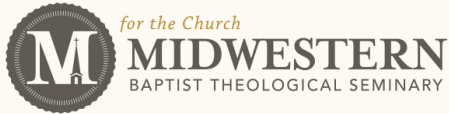

COURSES

EI's academic program is designed to foster both spiritual growth and intellectual depth, preparing students for a life of discipleship and service. The curriculum builds progressively over three years:

- **First Year:** Foundational courses focus on the essentials of discipleship, prayer, biblical studies, and the core doctrines of faith, establishing a solid basis for students to grow in their walk with God and understanding of His Word.
 - **Second Year:** Students dive deeper into the New Testament, explore key doctrines, and develop practical ministry skills like counseling and missions, equipping them to minister effectively and face spiritual challenges with confidence.
 - **Third Year:** Advanced coursework emphasizes exegesis, theology, and leadership, training students to apply Scripture accurately, lead others, and engage in ministry that is both biblically grounded and culturally relevant.

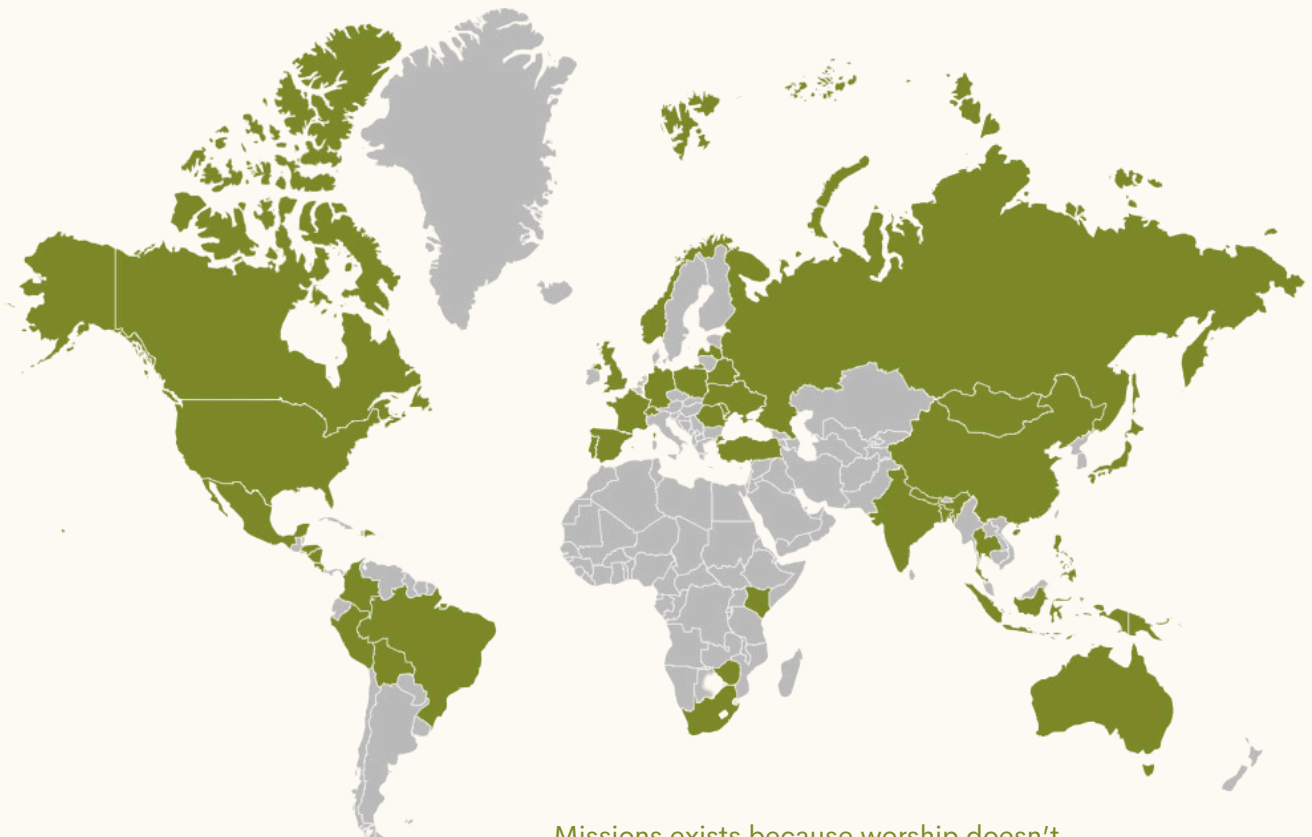

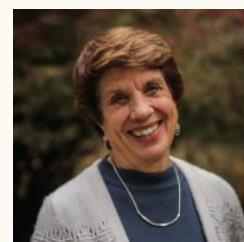

Why are we

NON-DENOM?

We are a Christian college which is **evangelical, non-denominational** and which focuses on **essential biblical truths** rather than on any particular **theological scheme** or doctrinal peculiarities.

THE BASICS OF OUR FAITH

At EI, we want every Christian to understand the powerful truths of the faith—truths that aren't hard to grasp but make a huge impact on how we live with Jesus. We believe that when you truly get these truths, they help you live out a genuine Christian life.

Since we're a non-denominational school, we welcome students from all kinds of Christian backgrounds. We encourage you to love the beliefs of your own tradition, but at the heart of everything we teach is the gospel—the good news of a real relationship with Jesus. That's why we have classes like Fundamentals of Discipleship, Romans, and The Prayer Class—each one designed to bring you closer to Jesus and help you understand His Word better.

While we're excited to see our students go on to study theology, our main goal is for each one to become a true disciple of Jesus. Whatever you end up doing—whether it's as a pastor, teacher, missionary, lawyer, or parent—we want you to walk closely with Jesus, grounded in faith and led by Him in all you do.



DOCTRINAL *statement*

God

We believe in one God, eternally existing in three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, equal in essence, power and glory. God is infinite in His knowledge and power, perfect in His character and ways, and is the Creator of and sovereign Lord over all things.

Scripture

We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are verbally inspired by God and without error in the original writings, and that they are the supreme and final authority for faith and life.

Man

We believe that Adam and Eve were created in the image and likeness of God. However, they sinned, and thereby incurred not only physical death, but also spiritual death, which is separation from God. As a consequence, this spiritual death has been transmitted to the entire human race so that all human beings are born with a sinful nature, become sinners in thought, word, and deed, and are therefore rightly deserving of eternal punishment.

Jesus Christ

We believe that Jesus Christ, the eternal Son of God, was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary, and is therefore fully God and fully man.

We believe that, out of His great love for guilty and lost human beings, God sent His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, to die for the sins of mankind as a representative and substitutionary sacrifice. Jesus was buried, and He rose from the dead three days later.

We believe that through His death and resurrection, Jesus bore the penalty of sin, appeased God's wrath, broke the power of sin and death, defeated Satan and secured eternal life for His people.

We believe in the bodily resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, His ascension into heaven, His enthronement as Lord of heaven and earth, and His present ministry there as High Priest and Advocate for all who believe in Him as Savior and Lord.

Salvation

We believe that all who repent of their sin and trust in the Lord Jesus Christ are justified by grace, apart from any of their works. Furthermore, all who receive the Lord Jesus by faith are born again of the Holy Spirit, and thereby become children of God.

Satan
